

The Island of Sodor

For anybody who has children or grandchildren you are probably familiar with the television series Thomas the Tank Engine and Friends. But did you know there was a connection to Barrowin-Furness? Thomas the Tank Engine television series was a spin-off from The Railway Series of books written by the Rev. W. Awdry. After successfully publishing four books. Awdry realized he needed some consistency in the locations for the next series of adventures. On a preaching engagement in the Isle of Man he was made aware that its bishop is officially titled Bishop of Sodor and Man, Sodor being the old Norse name for the Hebrides, whose ecclesiastical link to Man had long since lapsed. So Awdry simply recreated a new Sodor and positioned it in the Irish Sea between the Isle of Man and Barrow-in-Furness. In doing so he obliterated Walney Island.....some would say "good thing too", or one could argue that he merely enlarged Walney Island and changed the name.



And how do you get to Sodor? Well quite simply you board a North Western Railway train at Barrow Central Station and cross over Walney Channel via the Jubilee Bridge, a 120 ft span double track rolling lift bridge (designed by Sir Topham Hatt in 1915) and travel on to the NWR headquarters on Sodor at Vicarstown.
